Robert Franklin Bublitz, 91, of Nashville, Tennessee, formerly of Chester, Virginia, and McKinney, TX, passed away on Monday, March 23, 2020, at his home. Born at his family home in Maywood, Illinois on January 10, 1929, he was the son of the late Frank and Hazel Bublitz and was preceded in death by his two brothers, Melvin and John Bublitz. Robert loved studying the Bible and was a longtime member of Kingsland Baptist Church in Richmond, VA, where he served as a Deacon, Trustee, and Sunday School Teacher for 26 years. A United States Army Veteran, Mr. Bublitz honorably served his country in Greenland during World War II. He worked for more than 35 years as an employee of Reynolds Metals in Richmond, VA. With no formal post-high school training, he worked his way up through the company to become a design and research engineer in the packaging division.
